TREASURER REPORT

General account balance is \$56,411.48
Building account balance is \$100,349.23.
The Nevada account balance remains at \$237.61.
Bottle drive for the month to date is \$262.40.
Bottle drive prior month was \$697.60.

As part of the OTF grant, we paid \$2,599.00 for the water softener and \$15,524.60 to replace the heating /air units. We now have restricted funds in the amount of \$2,876.40 in the Building account.

As we continue to upgrade our building, some may have noticed that we have also replaced many of the windows and doors. The approximate cost will be in excess of \$21,000. This will need to be paid from the Building fund until such time as we receive the balance of the OTF grant. The funds are scheduled to be forwarded to us as follow: \$16,800.00 is to be paid in March 2025 and \$4,200.00 is to be paid in October 2025.

Finally, I would like to thank Linda Tucker for adjusting our point of sale registers on very short notice. We had a very small window to adjust our prices for the "GST/HST Holiday" that took effect on December 14 and will end February 15, 2025. A regular beer in the Club Room will now cost \$4.00.

BOTTLE DRIVE UPDATE



ONTARIO COMMAND FACT SHEET 2024

From the files of Ontario Command

The following Facts are gathered from a Branch Survey conducted for the Fiscal Year of 2022-2023. Please note that due to the Covid-19 Pandemic Lock Downs and Restrictions, Ontario Command Branches could not operate under normal conditions and were slow to bounce back after all restrictions were lifted. The below facts show that our Branches and Members continue to strongly support their Veterans and Communities!

The Legion at work in Ontario:

- There were 389 Branches, with a total membership of 100,000 strong as of December 2024 (92.5% of Ontario Command Branches responded to this survey)
- Total Poppy Donations received for 2023 were \$9,520,305.65. Statements throughout this Fact Sheet reflect where these funds were disbursed by Branches to support Veterans, their dependents and greater community
- Funds spent on Veterans Programs for 2023 totaled over \$3.5 million
- Branches and Ladies' Auxiliaries continue to support the Homeless Veterans Program "Operation: Leave the Streets Behind". As of December 2024, over \$3 million has been disbursed from the Ontario Command Homeless Veterans Fund and over \$100,000.00 from our Ladies' Auxiliary. As of this date 1242 Veterans have been assisted (of which 139 were female Veterans and 73 families) in 207 communities
- For the year 2023 Grants from Poppy funds, to the Royal Commonwealth Ex-Service League in the Caribbean totaled \$89,500.00
- Provide funding for Provincial Service Bureaus, for Provincial Service Officers to assist, all Veterans Currently Serving and Ex-Service Personnel, with pension applications, benefit concerns, on an ongoing basis free of charge
- Ontario Command is very proud to support "Operation Service Dog"! In collaboration with Wounded Warriors Canada this program has, and will continue, to drastically improve the lives of many Veterans! Since the beginning of

this partnership in 2018, Ontario Command Branches and Ladies' Auxiliaries have donated \$2.2 million to this program.

- Branches and Ladies' Auxiliary members continue to support Veterans in hospitals by supplying comforts and entertainment to enhance their quality of life
- Money Spent on Medical Equipment and Research totaled over \$600,000.00
- Not including funds spent on Veterans, over \$532,200.00 was used for Seniors' Programs
- Ontario Provincial Command Branches and Ladies' Auxiliaries Charitable Foundation approved \$671,322.00 to Ontario communities in 2023. Since its inception in 1979, donations approved amounted to over \$19,613,835.52 to various Hospitals, Hospices, Health Clinics, Homes for the Aged, Fire Departments and Charities in communities throughout Ontario.
- Through our Bursary program in the 2023-2024 academic year a total of 353 applications were awarded to students in need for post-secondary education in the total amount of \$441,250.00 in the Province of Ontario with the generous donations from the Ontario Command Legion Branches and the Ladies' Auxiliaries of Ontario Command. Since the academic year of 2002-2003 to 2023-2024 our Bursary program has made a total of 13,634 awards totaling \$7,715,075.00.
- Additional Bursaries from Branch Poppy Trust funds were awarded in the amount of \$634,350.00
- Sponsors and facilitates low rental housing for senior citizens
- Continued to support accessibility for Veterans, their families and the Communities in excess of \$543,800
- Continued to support Scouts Canada, Guides Canada, Army/Air/Sea/Navy Cadets, Canadian Junior Rangers and other Youth Programs in excess of \$1.6 million
- Other donations to local charities amount to over \$2 million, not from Poppy Trust Funds
- Donations to local Community Projects totaled over \$1.4 million
- Ontario Command Branch Members annually put in over 400,500 volunteer hours
- In 2023 Ontario Command Branches had over 6157 volunteer staff and employed over 1141 full time and part-time staff
- Ontario Command Branches offered their facilities free of charge to community groups for over 21,600 occasions in 2023



BRANCH HISTORIAN REPORT

Submitted by Comrade Norm Marion, Branch Historian The Coldwater Legion was born out of the efforts of Rev. Arthur Harden of Coldwater, who served as Chaplain in the First World War, and Rev. W.J. Province, a veteran of both World Wars. Coldwater Branch No 270 of the Canadian Legion of the British Empire Service League received its Charter on January 2, 1935 (see original above). The names of the founding members on the 1935 Charter are as follows: T. Langton; R.P. Bellamy; F.W. Brown; C.E. Stevens; Rev. H. Harden; W.V. Manning; B. Speerin; C.R. Orton; W.W. Williams; N.J. Evoy; H. Worrell; G. Dunlop; C.W. MacDougal; Rev. W.J. Province; G.V. Caswell; A. Watt; J. MacIndoo; J. Yule; R.J. Barker; and O.W. Lovelace. The first Legion building was donated by the Sheppard family, at one time the office of the Georgian Bay Lumber Company at the current site of the Medical Building on River Street. On July 9, 1952, the Legion Branch and its Ladies' Auxiliary opened their new building, Coronation Hall, a red brick house known as the Harvie home, located on Gray Street West across from Graymore. It was bought from Mrs. Gertrude Manning.

The third move was to the Denison House on Coldwater Road in 1962, where they remained until the construction of the new building at the current location on what was then Community Centre Drive (today Michael Anne Drive) in 1972. The corner stone was laid on November 11, 1971. The first function at the new building was the funeral of First World War Veteran and charter member Orley Lovelace. An addition to the building was completed in 1987. Over the years, the Coldwater Branch has been active in the community affairs of the village - both in assistance to veterans and their families and by sponsorship of a variety of functions and events, including supporting youth education and Air and Sea Cadets. Each year the Legion holds a Remembrance Day Service and parade, as well as the annual laying of crosses on Veterans graves at the Coldwater Cemetery. Thomas Langton was a founding member of Branch No. 270 of the Canadian Legion of the British Empire Service League - today's RCL Branch 270 (Coldwater), and was elected as the branch very first president in 1935.

MEET OUR FIRST PRESIDENT: THOMAS LANGTON

Thomas Langton Jr. was born in Toronto, on March 26, 1883, the son of Thomas and Florence (McDonald) Langton. On February 28, 1916, he enlisted with the 180th Battalion, Canadian Expeditionary Force, in Toronto. Attestation Form he is described as 32 years-old and single. He listed his trade as foreman, and stated he had no previous military experience. Langton, regimental number 862770, was commissioned to the rank of lieutenant shortly after joining. Thomas sailed on the S.S. Olympic to arrive in England on November 21, 1916. After several months of training in England he landed in France on April 25th, 1917, assigned to the 75th Canadian Infantry Battalion. He suffered gunshot wounds in the legs on June 8, 1917, and was returned to Canada for medical treatment. Thomas was discharged on April 6, 1918, and later moved to Coldwater, Ontario. In 1935 he became a founding member of Branch No. 270 of the Canadian Legion of the British Empire Service League - today's RCL Branch 270 (Coldwater), and was elected as the branch very first president. Thomas passed away on June 1, 1935, in Toronto.


