
#### TREASURER

#### **COLLECTION MANAGER**

Last month we honoured two of our First World War fallen soldiers from Coldwater, Private Charles Orr and Private James Langley, by lowering our flags to half-mast and posting a short biography on the day of the 100th anniversary of their passing. But in my previous Collection Manager report I neglected to mention that we have in our collection a significant piece that relates to Private Orr. Indeed, displayed as part of the Coldwater Collection is the original Memorial Plague, a bronze medallion often referred to as "Dead Man's Penny"; that was sent to Charles' mother Marion four years after his death. Memorial Plaques were issued starting in 1921 to the next-of-kin (mother, father, spouse, etc.) of all British Empire soldiers, sailors and airmen who were killed as a result of the war. The bronze medallions were engraved with the name of military personnel, intentionally without mention of the rank to underline the fact that there was no distinction between sacrifices made by individuals of different ranks.



#### **VETS CLEAR PERIMETER OF BRANCH 270**


