

We are extremely thankful for the generous donations received to help replenish our Building fund... many from anonymous donors. As you know, the cost of the new roof pretty much depleted our Building account and we continue to deal with SURPRISE repairs for an aging building. We have now entered into our slower summer month and these donations could not have come at a better time. Huge thank you for your support.

General account balance is \$32,735.36.

Building account balance is \$63,700.81. This balance is after paying for the resurfacing of our parking lot and allowing us to use the balance of our OTF grant for some badly needed electrical work.

The Nevada account balance remains at \$237.61. The bottle drive for the current month to date is \$650.80. The bottle drive prior month was \$504.80


MEMBERSHIP REPORT

At Toronto's branch 344, the day to celebrate Canada was also a day to celebrate the Legion and its mission.


"It was an outstanding day," says Keates. "My heart was singing. We even welcomed four or five new members. I'm just so happy, happy, happy."




