The Royal Canadian Legion calls on the Government to produce an implementation plan, including a detailed timeline and defined oversight. We will monitor the progress and outcome of the report and are committed to collaborate and assist to ensure the timely implementation of all recommendations.

## LEGION CALLS ON GOVERNMENT TO IMPLEMENT ACVA RECOMMENDATIONS TO SUPPORT WOMEN VETERANS

OTTAWA, ON, June 12, 2024 – The Royal Canadian Legion fully supports the recommendations outlined in the House of Commons Standing Committee on Veterans Affairs (ACVA) report titled Invisible No More. The Experiences of Canadian Women Veterans.

This landmark report, the largest ever carried out by the Committee, records for the first time the lived experiences of over 50 women Veterans with service from today to over the past 40 years. Their statements describe the horrific sexual abuse female CAF and RCMP Members and Veterans endured, the abuse of authority and the discrimination they suffered.

The testimony overwhelming highlighted how women Veterans have encountered barriers and challenges to have their service-related injuries recognized by Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC) for access to care, support and benefits. The lack of acknowledgment of the physical and mental injuries resulting from their service left many women feeling invisible and feeling they are not a Veteran.

"The 42 recommendations in the ACVA report provide a starting point for the CAF, RCMP and VAC to finally be held accountable for the experiences and wounds these Women who serve need to know that they matter, that abuse will not be tolerated, that they will receive care and support if injured and that the process to receive that care and support shows compassion and respect.

The Legion stands proudly with the more than 100,000 women who served our military and RCMP forces. We invite all Canadians to stand with us to honour their service, recognize their sacrifices, and uphold their legacy.

If you or a Veteran or family of a Veteran you know needs support, the Legion's Veterans Services Department offers a wide range of assistance, always free of charge. Canadian serving military, retired Veterans including RCMP members and their families can reach out to a Legion Command Service Office for assistance. Contact a professional Service Officer.

Remember the photo we published in the April Maple Leaf, showing our Coldwater Legion building all lit-up in blue to mark the RCAF centennial? Well, it's now official: the RCAF has entered the pages of the Guinness World Records book after setting a record for illuminating the most landmarks around the world in 24 hours. The record was set with 56 landmarks, as recognized by UNESCO or national governmental registers, illuminated in 24 hours. The previous record was 38. Landmarks were illuminated in blue worldwide, as far away as Australia and New-Zealand, South Korea and Irag. #### **BUILDING MANAGER REPORT**

Submitted by Comrade Kari Malmström, Building Manager I have the following report in the way of Second Vice/Building Manager since our last meeting.

My report is as follows:

- Monthly fire inspections are completed.
- John O'Hara and I attended the annual inspection for the Midland Sea Cadets June 9. The weather did not cooperate, but the turnout was still very good. Congratulations to all the cadets on a successful year. Nice to see their numbers growing.
- Parking lot paving was completed June 24. Thank you to everyone who helped in coordinating this to be done when I was out of town.
- All damaged or missing drop ceiling tiles have been replaced. We may have to get some more for downstairs as the pattern is not the same as upstairs.
- I will be working on getting some pricing on updating the various electrical issues, like light switches to be added and receptacles to be identified to solve some of our problems when breakers get tripped. I have a meeting this week with the electrician to get pricing on some repairs that are needed immediately. These include a dedicated receptacle for the upstairs A/C unit and also a cost for putting in switches for the upstairs hall lighting. I will ask about labelling all receptacles at the same time.
- Upstairs A/C was fixed. Two fuses had blown causing only one unit to work and it ended up freezing up and dripping water into the hall.
- I had the plumber come in and clear out one of the ladies toilets upstairs. He noted that the flush mechanism was leaking, and that was replaced. This again indicates that the poor quality of town water is causing issues on our new fixtures. If the township is not going to do anything about water quality, we will have to look at options in-house.

# LEGION'S NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR COMMAND SPARKS MOMENTOUS REPATRIATION AND COMMEMORATION

From the files of Dominion Command

OTTAWA, ON, 26 June 2024 – The Royal Canadian Legion's Newfoundland and Labrador Command is now bracing for what will be another highly emotional commemorative event, after recently helping repatriate the remains of an unknown Newfoundland soldier back home from France.

"I am deeply moved by the actions of our comrades at Newfoundland and Labrador (NL) Command," says Bruce Julian, Dominion President. "Their vision and persistence in making this happen will have an enduring and positive impact in that province and also touches citizens from across Canada and beyond."

In May, a special delegation traveled from Canada to France to receive the remains of an unknown First World War soldier from Newfoundland who served at Beaumont-Hamel in France; at a time when that province was a separate dominion of the British Empire and not yet part of Canada.

"Many Canadians would be unfamiliar with the degree of sacrifice made during that war by a comparatively large contingent of soldiers from this region," says Berkley Lawrence, Immediate Past President of NL Command and First Vice President of the Legion's Dominion Command. A veteran himself, and deeply moved by the repatriation event, Lawrence says witnessing the act of receiving the remains of the unknown soldier from the French military, touched him to the core.

"I was feeling all kinds of emotions even more deeply than I knew I would," he says. "I still am." Lawrence's own grandfather served during the First World War including during the Battle of the Somme and later in Gueudecourt,

in northern France, where a memorial now stands in honour of Newfoundland soldiers.

On July 1, the Unknown Soldier will be interred at the refurbished Newfoundland National War Memorial which will be rededicated to mark its 100th anniversary. These events were planned and are being executed in close partnership with all levels of government and additional supporters.

A challenging dual project in the works for several years, the idea was that of former NL Command President and veteran Frank Sullivan. He believed there was a need to honour all Newfoundlanders and Labradorians who served, some of whom remain unknown — and are resting elsewhere in the world.

"I really felt it was important to Newfoundland and Labrador, and our country, to ensure we never forget the sacrifices made by a significant part of our province's population during both world wars, up until joining Canada in 1949," he explains. Sullivan says the Unknown Soldier will symbolize all those from the province who gave their lives serving in all branches of the military and in respective support services. "Descendants and supporters of those who served, died and lie in "Known unto God" graves will now be able to pay their respects in person at our National War Memorial," he says.

Sullivan worked closely with Lawrence and others to help orchestrate elements of the repatriation and the upcoming commemoration. That province's national war memorial honours the collective sacrifices and service of all those from Newfoundland and Labrador who have served.

The Unknown Soldier will lie in state in the East Block Lobby of the Confederation Building in St. John's from June 28-30 and the public is invited to pay their respects. On July 1, Memorial Day in NL, the Unknown Soldier will be laid to rest at the Newfoundland National War Memorial site. The rededication of the refurbished memorial which overlooks the harbour at the site of the annual Memorial Day service, will take place at the same time.

There is a welcome increase in defence spending but it comes alongside the reality of defence budget cutbacks, so the funding increase is not what it looks like.

There is a crucial proposal to fix the outdated procurement process, but still no actual completion date for a planned – and urgently needed - procurement strategy.

On June 23 a monument in memory of Air Cadet Stanley Peacock was unveiled near Royal Canadian Legion Branch 34 Orillia. Peacock was killed during the Second World War when he was caught in the explosion of a boat he was working on in the harbour. You will find the background story related to that event on this page.



#### **HUNTER BOATS IN ORILLIA**

In the early 1900's, Hunter Boats in Orillia built pleasure water craft and sailboats. During World War II, their focus turned towards supporting Canadian war efforts. Alistair Hunter was the first to take on the job of building the Fairmile Patrol Boat. He designed and built seven of 80 Fairmile submarine patrol boats built in Canada during World War II. The ships were built from mahogany planks and equipped with depth charges and Oerlikon guns.



#### FAIRMILE PATROL BOAT & STANLEY PEACOCK

The Q116 was the last Fairmile built by Hunter Boats. But, its story was marked by tragedy on October 13, 1943, on Lake Couchiching in Orillia. When workers returned after dinner, one of the engineers heard a dripping sound. Within minutes the gas ignited. In the resulting explosion, Stanley Peacock, a 16 year old apprentice electrician, was blown out of the ship and was not found until the next day. Stanley was also an Air Cadet in the Orillia 99 Lynx Squadron Air cadets.

#### **ACTIONS OF THE ORILLIA FIRE DEPARTMENT**

With the quick action of two Orillia firefighters, Captain Elgin Jones and Lieutenant Daniel MacLeish, the fire department contained the fire and prevented further loss of life. For their actions they were awarded the King George VI Police and Fire Service Medal for gallantry. Only 10 such medals were awarded in Canada and Orillia firefighters received two.


