### **BUILDING MANAGER REPORT**

Submitted by Comrade Kari Malmström, Building Manager I have the following report in the way of 1st Vice/ Building Manager since our last meeting.

My report is as follows:

- Monthly fire inspections are completed with some repairs still to be completed.
- I attended the District E Fall Convention in Stouffville Oct 4, 5, and 6. Discussions included the distribution of assets from the closing of the Woodbridge Branch, grants or funding for accessible bathrooms, opening of the new branch at Wasaga Beach, and more. The entire agenda booklet is available at the branch for anyone's review.
- I met with the roads department from Severn Township on October 7 in regard to the property lines at the south end of our parking lot. Where the property lines were marked out, we would lose most of our parking spaces on the roadside, as well as a large strip off the Cenotaph area. After the meeting I reached out to Deputy Mayor Judith Cox with my concerns and now the Township is reviewing options. I also met with our councilor Dan Janssen prior to our general meeting and he assured me that he would be looking into our concerns with the parking.
- The water softener and filtration system has been installed and is working. This will reduce the damage caused by the hard water to other appliances. This was completed using the grant received from the Ontario Trillium Foundation.
- Doors and windows replacement will happen in about four weeks.
- Still waiting for clarification on the pricing for the heat pump/ac replacements. There may be a slight increase from the 2023 quote submitted for the grant.
- Still waiting for door hardware pricing of self-closing doors where they are not working properly.
- Using the deck blocks we had, I was able to level the shed supports and have it moved to the agreed location. I want to thank Bev and Miles Southorn for moving the shed with their tractor.

### HONOURING A CENTURY OF SERVICE

A Special RCAF 100th Anniversary Flypast for the National Remembrance Day Ceremony

From the files of Dominion Command

OTTAWA, 26 October 2024 – Each year, at the National Remembrance Day Ceremony at the National War Memorial in Ottawa, countless Canadians come together to pay tribute to our Veterans and mourn those who gave their lives in service to our country.

This year, at 11:30 a.m., as the solemn notes of God Save the King fill the air, a special flypast of vintage military aircraft will soar above, marking the 100th anniversary of the Royal Canadian Air Force. Each aircraft, painted to honour the memory of a Canadian Veteran, serves as a powerful tribute to their sacrifice and the century-long legacy of the RCAF's service and dedication to our nation.

### **HAWKER HURRICANE**

The British Hawker Hurricane—a renowned single-seat fighter aircraft—serves as a poignant symbol of courage and sacrifice. This aircraft was responsible for 60 percent of the Luftwaffe's losses during the Battle of Britain. The restored Hurricane pays tribute to Flying Officer William Lidstone McKnight, who served with the Royal Air Force's No. 242 (All Canadian) Squadron. Though McKnight was lost in combat in 1941, his memory and spirit are honoured through this aircraft, a reminder of the bravery of those who gave their all for freedom.

#### SUPERMARINE SPITFIRE MK XII

The second aircraft to grace the skies is the iconic Spitfire, a highly capable and elegant fighter, known for its speed and admired by the pilots who flew it—many of whom were trained in Canada. This particular Spitfire is painted in tribute to Arnold Roseland, a Canadian pilot who flew with the Royal Canadian Air Force's 442 Squadron on more than 65 missions before being shot down and killed over Normandy in 1944.

### **HARVARD 4**


As the third and final plane in this year's National Remembrance Day Ceremony flypast, the Harvard 4 takes to the sky, symbolizing a critical chapter in the training of Allied pilots during the Second World War. This particular Harvard is painted in the distinct markings of an aircraft flown by Pilot Officer John Gillespie Magee, an Anglo-American aviator who trained at No. 2 Service Flying Training School in Ottawa. Magee is best remembered for penning the iconic poem High Flight, a stirring ode to the joy of flying, often recited at aviators' funerals. In Magee's memory, this Harvard serves as a powerful tribute to the thousands of pilots trained in Canada, whose skills and sacrifices helped shape the outcome of the war.

### THE NATIONAL REMEMBRANCE DAY CEREMONY

The Royal Canadian Legion, on behalf of the people of Canada, organizes and conducts the National Remembrance Day service in Ottawa. Legion National Headquarters shares information and updates on the 2024 Ceremony.

### **BRANCH HISTORIAN REPORT**

Submitted by Comrade Norm Marion, Branch Historian Six new Veteran banners were produced this year, which brings the total of banners to 61. They are now up in the store front windows along main street in Coldwater, and will be there on display until after Remembrance Day. Arrangements were made to get CTV coverage of our banner program. So far the program has raised more than \$4,000 in donations to the Poppy Fund.

I will be making a presentation about my experiences during the 1974 war in Cyprus on Sunday November 24, starting at 1 p.m. This will be a first attempt to see if there is an interest for this kind of thing in the local community. If there is, it may be followed by other presentations by Veterans or authors of military books.

A submission was sent for the Military Service Recognition Book (MSRB). It features Percy George Tipping, a First World War Veteran. Submissions or suggestions for MSRB are welcome at any time during the year. A sample submission featuring Coldwater Branch Past President Jack Walsh is included on this page. Note that copies of this year's MSRB Volume XI have been received and are available at the branch.

### WALSH, JOHN JOSEPH (JACK)

John Joseph Walsh was born in Toronto on July 15, 1918, son of John and Mary Ellen Walsh. During the Second World War, "Jack", as he was known, enrolled with the Royal Canadian Air Force in Toronto on June 17, 1942. Leading Aircraftman (LAC) Walsh, service number R-170953, served with the RCAF in Canada until he was discharged on September 5, 1945. He was awarded the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and the British War Medal 1939-1945. After the war he worked as a driver for the Toronto Transit Commission until he retired. married Grace (Sanderson) and together they had five children. Jack was active in the Royal Canadian Legion, joining in 1973 and serving as President at Branch 270 Coldwater from 1992 to 1994, eventually being awarded Life Membership. Jack passed away on March 17, 1995, at age 77. He is buried in the Coldwater Cemetery.
