Starting Sunday, September 15, our week-long celebration stems from a tradition that some Provincial Commands and local Branches have honoured since the 1980s.


#### OBJECTIVE

National Legion Week is designed to educate visitors on the good work their local Branch does in their community. It reinforces the important role Branches play in our shared mission to serve and support our Veterans, as well as contribute to the well-being of so many communities. It serves as a vehicle to drive new traffic to Branches, attract new members and sign up new volunteers. This year, it can also include a salute to RCAF Veterans who celebrated the 100th anniversary (April 1) of the Royal Canadian Air Force.

# **PUBLIC RELATIONS REPORT**



# **REPORT ON DOMINION CONVENTION**

Submitted by Comrade Anne Frankish, Branch President The RCL Dominion Convention was held in Saint John, New Brunswick August 24-28, 2024.

All the provinces and territories were represented and it was interesting to learn that there are 12 Legions in the United States and four in Europe. There were almost 3,000 attendees.

There were many key note speakers. I will highlight some. Mike Trauner, an Army Veteran of Canada's mission in Afghanistan, shared his story on how he lost both legs while serving. There was not a dry eye in the centre. He is the Legion's National Ambassador for Youth Track and Field. Todd Ross spoke on behalf of Rainbow Veterans of Canada. His story was an eye opener to this writer, and I am sure to many attendees at the conference. The Minister of Veterans Affairs, Ginette Petitpas Taylor, was the final keynote speaker. She shared how the government has worked with Dominion Command and will continue to do so for our Veterans.

The membership chair of Dominion Command hopes that the membership for the RCL will reach the 300,000 mark for the 2024 year. There was discussion about the quality of the Poppy supplies. They are aware of this and are looking in to changing this, once supplies have been depleted. A new section has been added to the Poster and Literary Contests; videos of Remembrance are now a category. An Equity, Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) Committee has been developed. They are "striving to embed Equity, Diversity and Inclusion into the cultures of all levels of the Royal Canadian Legion". The per capita tax will be increased by \$1.25.

Elections were held throughout the five days we were there. The new President of Dominion Command is Berkley Lawrence, 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President John Mahon, three Vice Presidents Valerie McGregor, Sharon McKeown - who is Comrade Betty Jean Murray's sister - and Garry Pond from Ontario Command. The Treasurer is Jill Carleton and Chair is Bill Chafe. On behalf of RCL Branch 270 Coldwater I wish them a productive two years.

In conclusion I would like to thank RCL Branch 270 Coldwater members and Executive for supporting Comrade Debbie Southorn and myself to represent you at the 49<sup>th</sup> Dominion Convention in New Brunswick.

# **BUILDING MANAGER REPORT**

My report is as follows: - Monthly fire inspections are completed and a few issues were noticed. Two emergency lights do not operate. Hoping that a battery replacement done in house will correct this;

- I removed and installed the steel shelves in the safe room; - We had our annual fire inspection done August 2 by Jake Hawkins of Severn Township. The following needs to be addressed as per the inspection: Class K extinguisher in canteen has to be mounted on the wall with instruction card mounted above it; Plastic electrical cover in canteen needs to be replaced (cracked); Two emergency lights mentioned above need to be repaired; the door hardware with panic bars need to be replaced as they will not lock every time when closing; the Fire Alarm pull stations need the instruction posted where missing; and our Emergency Plan needs to be updated with new contacts.

I will complete all except the door hardware.

**46TH ANNUAL LEGION NATIONALS** 

From the files of Dominion Command

CALGARY, AB, 9 AUGUST 2024 – In front of the Games' largest contingent of young athletes ever, and with the firing of the starting pistol at Thursday evening's Opening Ceremonies, this year's edition of the Legion Nationals is now officially underway at the Foothills Athletic Park in Calgary.

Competition in 84 events ranging from running relays to long jumps, will see over 965 athletes from across Canada come together for some friendly yet serious rivalry. This year's Games hosted by The City of Calgary and the Calgary Track Council, run from August 9-11. The Legion Nationals are Canada's only track and field competition for the under-16 and under-18 categories.

"There is nothing else like this, for Canada's youngest track and field stars," says Brian Weaver, Legion Sports Committee Chair and Dominion Vice President. "This is where it happens. It's where they can shoot for medals and personal bests, learn about leadership and experience cross-country camaraderie, and set the stage for their future whatever that might hold."

Invictus medalist and competitive rower and cyclist Michael Trauner is back for a second year as Games Ambassador to help encourage the athletes with his personal story - and root for them as they compete.

"It's time for all of them to also take a moment to reflect on all the hard work, dedication and sacrifices they have made to be here in Calgary representing their teams and provinces," says Trauner, who has won 35 medals and counting, in a range of competitions. "It's not an easy task to balance busy lives and schedules with the sports we all love so much in the hopes of excelling beyond expectation to compete in a forever lifechanging event," he adds.

This is the 46th year for the event organized by The Royal Canadian Legion. The competition grew from Legionnaires' support and promotion of youth sports as a healthy activity to help children whose fathers or mothers were serving abroad or had served in the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF). The Legion later developed local, provincial, and national youth athletic programs, which now culminate in the games.

"We deeply thank the Local Organizing Committee and all volunteers for what they've done to make this an incredible experience for all our athletes," says Brian Weaver, Legion Sports Chair. This year's championships commemorate the 10th anniversary of the end of Canada's mission in Afghanistan from 2011-2014. The Legion recognizes these CAF members in both thought and through the design of this year's winning medals.

"A remembrance theme is central to our Games every year," says Bruce Julian, Dominion President. "More than 40,000 Canadian Armed Forces members served in Afghanistan, and 158 of them gave their lives in the name of peace and freedom. Over the course of this competition, we ask athletes to take a moment to think of these members, and to recognize the importance of their service."

The Legion's Dominion Command sponsors hundreds of athletes each year, with the support of branches and provincial or territorial commands from across the country. Several hundred other youth join as open athletes. All Legion Commands are represented this year by over 300 competitors; and there are over 600 Open athletes.

Legion Nationals athletes have gone on to compete at the international level including as part of the Commonwealth, Pan Am and even the Olympic games – and several are competing in Paris this year, such as former alum Ethan Katzberg, who just won gold in last Sunday's Olympic men's hammer throw final.

The Legion is grateful to all its generous sponsors including key supporters PIB Inc., and the Professional Institute of the Public Service of Canada. The organization also thanks Cochrane Toyota for providing two Games shuttles. Selected Canadian cities host the Legion Nationals for two years in a row, so Calgary will host again in 2025.

I sent in a submission for the Military Service Recognition Book (MSRB) about Claude Sauvé, a former Veteran and member of the branch who passed away earlier this year. Claude is featured on this page. New submissions or suggestions for submissions for MSRB are always welcome at any time during the year.

# **CLAUDE ROSS SAUVÉ**

Claude Ross Sauvé was born in Matchedash Township, Ontario, on January 12, 1939, son of Charles and Georgina Sauvé. By the 1950s he lived in Fesserton, near the village of Coldwater, Ontario. Claude enrolled with the Canadian Army on April 6, 1956, assigned to the Royal Canadian Regiment (RCR) based in London, Ontario. He served with that regiment through the '60s and '70s, including two tours with NATO in Germany in 1965-1969 and 1971-1975, and a six-month peacekeeping tour under the United Nations in Cyprus in 1970. He was also deployed in Québec for six months in 1970 during the FLQ crisis, under the War Measures Act. Claude was released from the Canadian Armed Forces on June 21, 1980. He was a member of Royal Canadian Legion Branch 270 Coldwater. Claude passed away on October 25, 2023. He is buried in Waubaushene, Ontario.
