NO. 2 CONSTRUCTION BATTALION

February being Black History Month, we share with you the following article from the files of Veterans Affairs Canada.

On July 5, 1916, the No. 2 Construction Battalion was formed in Pictou, Nova Scotia—the largest Black military unit in Canadian history. Recruitment took place across the country and approximately 800 personnel would serve with the battalion at some point during the First World War. Most were from Nova Scotia, with others coming from New Brunswick, Ontario, the West and even some from the United States.

The segregated battalion was tasked with non-combat support roles. After initial service in Canada, the battalion boarded the SS Southland bound for Liverpool, England in March 1917. Its members were sent to eastern France later in 1917 where they served honourably with the Canadian Forestry Corps. There they helped provide the lumber required to maintain trenches on the front lines, as well as helped improve roads and build a railway. After the end of the First World War in November 1918, the men sailed to

Halifax in early 1919 to return to civilian life and the unit was officially disbanded in 1920.

In addition to the men of the Black Battalion, more than 700 Black Canadians – including soldiers like James Grant, Roy Fells, James Post, Lancelot Bertrand, Henry Thomas Shepherd, Miles Dymond, Jeremiah Jones and Curly Christian – also managed to join other units. They would offer distinguished service that earned some of them medals for bravery at places like Ypres, Vimy Ridge, Hill 70 and Passchendaele.



My report is as follows:

- The monthly extinguisher/exit light review is completed. An electrician has been contacted to come in and replace an exit light for upstairs;
- Upstairs' broken cooler handle has been replaced;



From the files of Dominion Command

We understand that your military medals, awards and service records are valuable to you and your loved ones. Information on how to replace lost medals or records, or obtain ones to which you were entitled, is available below.



LOST MEDALS

Information on service medals or records is available on the Government of Canada website.

Veterans Affairs Canada is responsible for first issue or replacement medals for those who served in the Second World War, Merchant Navy and the Korean War. Please contact 1-866-522-2122 or visit Government of Canada website

If you served after the Korea War, please contact National Defence at 1-877-741-8332 or visit Government of Canada website

If you have tried to obtain replacement medals or entitlement but have been unsuccessful or if you would like advice on related subjects such as recovering stolen medals, identifying medals, returning found medals to family, or mounting and displaying medals, our Medals Adviser can help. Please email your question to Dominion

Command at veteransservices@legion.ca and indicate in the subject line "For Medals Adviser".

Dominion Command's Medals Adviser is Major (Retired) W.E. (Gary) Campbell, a former member of the Canadian Armed Forces.

For mounting and displaying medals, we encourage you to contact the militaria business in your area.

SERVICE RECORDS

Due to privacy and confidentiality policies, Dominion Command does not release contact information or information on the service records of Veterans or Legion members. When researching military records, we recommend you contact Library and Archives Canada.



THIS MONTH WE REMEMBER

TOMMY PRINCE ON RECONNAISSANCE

On February 8, 1944, near Littoria, Italy, Sergeant Tommy Prince was spying on the Germans. An abandoned farmhouse close to the enemy served as his observation post, and a telephone wire connected him to the force. During his solo watch, Prince's communication line was severed by shelling. Prince donned civilian clothing, grabbed a hoe and, in full view of German soldiers, acted like a farmer weeding his crops. He found where the line was damaged, then, pretending to tie his shoelaces, quickly rejoined the wires. His reporting continued and Prince earned the Military Medal.

BRANCH HISTORIAN REPORT

Submitted by Comrade Norm Marion, Branch Historian I have four submissions ready to go (just waiting for signatures) for Military Service Recognition Book (MSRB) Vol XI. New submissions or suggestions for submissions for that edition are welcome. You can see a sample MSRB write-up for Harvey Phillips on this page. Harvey, who was killed in action at Dieppe during the Second World War, was the brother of branch member Frank Phillips, who celebrated his 98th birthday in January.

We received a message from the provincial coordinator for the MSRB program, announcing a contest to see which branch/district can have the most MSRB submissions during the months of February and March. Our branch was singled out in the message as the top branch in the province so far in the current campaign.

HARVEY HAROLD PHILLIPS

Harvey Harold Phillips was born in Toronto on October 10, 1920, son of Harold Hackett and Edna Belle Phillips. Prior to the Second World War, Harvey worked as a messenger for the Canadian Pacific Railway. He was also a Scoutmaster with the 95th Toronto Troop, and had joined the militia with the Irish Regiment of Canada in 1938. Following Canada's declaration of war, Harvey enlisted in Toronto with the Royal Regiment of Canada, Canadian Active Service Force, on September 7, 1939. He was single. Then on June 10, 1940, Private Harvey Phillips, service number B/66577, left Canada for Reykjavik, Iceland, with his unit for a four-month stay as garrison duty, before landing in the United Kingdom on November 3, 1940. He had initially joined the unit as a bugler, but was later transferred to Orderly Room work. On August 18, 1942, he crossed to France as part of Operation Jubilee, the ill-fated Dieppe Raid. Harvey was reported missing the next day, and later confirmed killed in action against the enemy on August 19, 1942. He is buried in France at the Dieppe Canadian War Cemetery.


