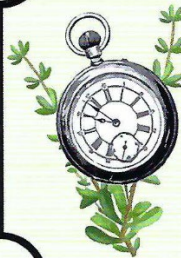

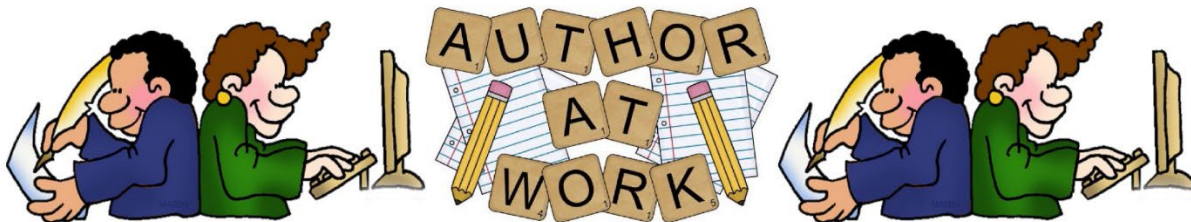

BUILDING MANAGER REPORT

I have the following report in the way of 1st Vice/ Building Manager since our last meeting.

My report is as follows:

- Monthly fire inspections are completed with some repairs completed (replacement of emergency light battery). Still pending door hardware replacement.
- I want to thank all the volunteers who helped in making the Annual Witches Walk dance upstairs a success. With all the helpers, the event ran much smoother than previously. We were around 180 people upstairs and the same downstairs.
- A group of volunteers came out one Sunday to clean up the collection display cases. They look great again and, hopefully, having sealed-up some of the upper holes, less dust will get in.
- It was great to see such a good turnout for our Remembrance Day ceremony. The weather was good until the end. Thank you to everyone involved and those who came out.
- The new heat pump/AC units are installed and working well.
- The water filtration and softener seem to be doing their job. I estimate that the cost for salt is about \$40/month at current water usage (four bags a month)
- I have received the estimate for replacing the interior door closure hardware. This was discussed at our November General Meeting. We will replace the doors.
- Also costs for improving the audio system downstairs will be further discussed with cost and details.
- Repairs were needed recently for the ice maker downstairs. The faulty receptacle in the upstairs kitchen has been replaced and another one added for the two coffee makers.
- I also replaced the faucet in the upstairs kitchen as requested using an existing faucet.

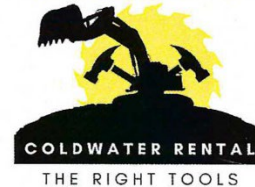
